

A word from the heart



The Lenten season has begun and I would like to invite you to join a small group on Mondays at 12:00-1:00 PM to engage in spiritual practices. The group is called “Deep Dive: Exploring Everyday Spiritual Practices” and will be exploring (and practicing) a new spiritual practice each week.

As we begin this journey you might be wondering: what is the importance of practicing our spirituality? One helpful perspective comes from a psychologist and researcher, Brenè Brown, who writes about this in her book, *The Gifts of Imperfection*. She writes:

“Spirituality is recognizing and celebrating that we are all inextricably connected to each other by a power greater than all of us, and that our connection to that power and to one another is grounded in love and compassion. Practicing spirituality brings a sense of perspective, meaning, and purpose to our lives.”

Each of us will express our spirituality in different ways, yet spirituality is a gift God uses to connect us to one another. We have included a variety of spiritual practices for this reason. You can come every week or choose one or two that resonates with you.

Monday, February 27th: Introduction to Spiritual Practices

Monday, March 6th: Lectio and Visio Divina

Monday, March 13th: Forgiveness

Monday, March 20th: Wonder and Imagination

Monday, March 27th: Revitalization

Monday, April 3rd: Labyrinth

Education Hour for 3 year olds-6th Graders and 7th-9th Graders will be held **Sunday, March 5th at 10:15 am.**


Sunday Schoolers will be with Maddy, and Confirmands will be learning from Erica Nelson, all about Lent and Holy Week!


