
Joyful Times will be headed to John Deere Tractor Cab Assembly on November 16.

I love October. I especially think of the quote from Anne of Green Gables: "I'm so glad I live in a world where there are Octobers. It would be terrible if we just skipped from September to November, wouldn't it?" October is a beautiful season of falling leaves, cooler weather, and pumpkin and apple flavors. But it's also a season of loss and change. When all seems lost, we hold onto the hope that what dies now will bring forth new life in the spring. October can be more emotionally difficult for this reason. Like with all loss and grief, or a particular life season, don't we often want to skip right past it?

I want to share with you a blessing from Kate Bowler and Jessica Richie's book, The Lives We Actually Have. It's written for caregivers. If you are caring for a loved one and feel overwhelmed or exhausted, this blessing is for you. You don't have to go through it alone. In fact, caring for others is built into our DNA as people of faith. All of us are called to care for others and love our neighbor (Mark 12:30-31). Imagine what our homes, neighborhoods, and communities would look like if we truly lived out this calling each and every day. But it's OK to allow ourselves to mourn the losses we accumulate in these demanding seasons, to take the time to be heard and seen, to depend on others for support. —Pastor Kristi
