Bethlehem Family and Friends,

Gabby (our Community Engagement Coordinator) and I recently had a great time at the ThreeHouse Collaborative Campus Ministry Block Party, welcoming UNI students back to campus. While we were there, we shared snacks and gave away cups that read “**Find where you belong at bethlehemcf.org**”. And it got me thinking about each of you, and how many of you have found places to plug in at Bethlehem or how others of you might be looking to find where you belong, as well. I also was reflecting on how some among our church family may be in a season of changing how we volunteer, or what ministries we volunteer with at Bethlehem, while others are looking at getting involved for the first time.

Regardless of what stage of belonging you are at, I wanted to let you know of a couple of opportunities to get involved coming up this month. First, we have a couple of new groups forming. One is a **Moms Group** of Infants-Prechoolers that is starting Sept 9. Another is a monthly **Grief Group** that will be meeting to support each other through the grieving process. Finally, if you still aren't sure how to find your fit, or you just want to find out more about where you belong within the ministries happening inside and outside our walls, I hope you will consider joining us for the **Ministry Fair** that is happening **Sunday, Sept 10, at 10 am**. We encourage all members and friends of Bethlehem to come and explore new ways you might belong here.

I am excited to announce that we are offering a new, ongoing, monthly Grief Group on the 4th Tuesday of the month, beginning September 26th, 10:00am-11:00am, in our recently updated Gathering Spot (Library). No registration is required, but if you would like to be added to our Grief Group Email List, please call the church office or email me at pastorkristi.grieder@gmail.com and you will automatically receive email reminders about upcoming offerings.

All are welcome to come and join us for coffee, support, and conversation. We ask each participant to uphold a covenant of trust and confidentiality to make it a safe place. This month will be an Open Topic Session, which means you are invited to share any loss that you are grieving with the group. You may have lost a loved one recently or years ago. You are also welcome to come and just listen if you are not ready to talk about your loss yet. Being present and listening to others process their grief can still be very beneficial to you.

There are numerous types of losses beyond losing a loved one to death. You may have lost a job, experienced a loss of health or loss of independence due to a new diagnosis, or a loss of relationship due to divorce or estrangement. These are what we call non-death or "living losses." Regardless, all of these losses are valid, real, and appropriate to bring to Grief Group. A sense of loss can be stirred up in us during certain holidays and anniversaries, or even with the changing of seasons. This is why it is our goal at Bethlehem to have an ongoing group available to those who need it, where friends or individuals from the community are also invited to drop in.

In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus teaches that, "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in his field; it is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches" (Matt. 13:31-32).

Often, healing is like this small seed. God's kingdom of compassion, mercy, and healing is planted in simple, often unseen, ways. But it has the potential to become a source of resilience and strength, not only for us, but for others who may be going through a similar thing. We hope that this group can be a branch or an extension of our ministry at Bethlehem so that people can find refuge, safety, and comfort as they continue to journey through life and loss.

As always, please email, text, or call me if you would like to make an appointment to talk through an issue you are facing in your life. I am available to meet with you over the phone, in a coffee shop, or the church office—wherever you are the most comfortable. My hope is to provide a safe place where you are heard, which can be so rare and hard to find these days.


