Bethlehem's Mission Statement is Sharing the Bread of Life with a Hungry World. One way this is done is through is our outreach with being a participant in Cedar Falls Community Meals.

During the Farm Crisis of the 1980s, Bethlehem along several other churches provided meals to help the Cedar Falls/Waterloo families get through those tough times. Today Bethlehem plus 8 other churches serve meals every Tuesday evening at the United Methodist Church in downtown Cedar Falls. Around 120 meals are served on an average Tuesday. The guests that come are from group homes, single adults and families.

Each church prepares their own meals and funds them. Bethlehem gets its funding from Bethlehem's Endowment Fund and other gifts. Bethlehem serves meal on the third Tuesday in the months of February, April, June, August, October and December. It takes around 16 Volunteers to get this job done.

The tasks of the volunteers are setting up the tables and chairs, making the food, serving the food and clean up. The majority of the volunteers arrive around 4:15. Three weeks before Bethlehem serves there will be a sign-up sheet on the welcome table. Please consider volunteering if you are able. One area that could use more people is from 5:00 or later to assist with clean up and taking down the tables and chairs.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Easter is coming! The weather will be getting warmer (hopefully) and signs of spring are soon among us. I love celebrating Easter —not just the one day, but the whole season. Just as we have a Lenten season, we celebrate an entire season of Easter until Pentecost. It is a time to look for the Risen Christ among us, especially in the people around us. The Easter season renews our hope in the One who gives us new life each and every day by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Just as we have seasons in the church year, we also have seasons in our lives. Seasons of joy are just as important as seasons of struggle. Grief has its own seasons, too. Though the grief journey is never really "over" and you can't just "get over it", our grief journey looks differently over time. This is why it is important to have continual support and places for community where you can bring your grief and be yourself. This month we will have a follow-up gathering for our first Grief Group that met in January and February. We will reconnect with one another and continue to support each other on the ongoing grief journey. We will meet at church at **10:00am on Monday, April 24th**.

I also want to invite all of you to consider joining a new Grief Group that will be beginning at the end of April. You can join this group regardless of when the loss occurred. It does not have to be recent. You can be grieving any person in your life; it does not need to be immediate family. The group is an opportunity to connect with others who are also on their own individual grief journeys. In the 5 sessions, we will hold space for you to express your authentic feelings and challenges as well as cover some frameworks to equip you for the journey, such as what grief is and what it is not, how to process emotions, the role of faith and spirituality in grief, and finding meaning. Members of the group will form a covenant of safe space practices including confidentiality, active listening, and practicing non-judgment. I hope you will consider joining this group if you are struggling and needing support in your grief journey.


