Bethlehem Family and Friends,

At the writing of this article, we are in the middle of Holy Week and waiting with baited breath for Easter Sunday when we can proclaim again together "Alleluia! Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed!"

During Lent, many of us give up something as a reminder of the sacrifice that Jesus gave for us. Still others add a spiritual practice so that we might deepen our relationship with God during the Lenten season. We gather for soup suppers and midweek worship, and we grow in our faith and in our relationships to one another.

As we enter into Easter, and we no longer have midweek worship services together, I began to wonder what might it look like to have some Easter spiritual practices in line with the disciples post-resurrection after the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. Grab your Bible and check out Acts 2, verses 42-47, and you'll see what I mean.

I began to wonder what might change at Bethlehem if we were to, like those first believers, continue to devote ourselves to learning, to eating together and to prayer. If we were to be intentional about those things, and if we were to continue to take the time to praise God and serve others, how might God continue to work through us for the good of our congregation and wider community.

This newsletter is filled with chances for you to do these things...you could choose to learn at the Adult Education class on April 14, or at the Confirmation or Women's Retreats. You could choose to join in sharing food at the All Church Birthday Party on April 28, or to come together to pray and celebrate God's goodness at the Congregational Meeting on April 21.

Or, if none of those things speak to you in a way of growing your faith, I welcome a chance to talk to you about how we might partner together to do so. Come and tell me your ideas of how we can learn, fellowship, pray, praise, and serve together, and together let's continue to do our best to make Bethlehem a place where we work to share the Bread of Life with a hungry world, and where all people find welcome and a place to belong.

Thank you, thank you friends, for all that you have done to make Lent and Holy Week so special. May this Easter be a season that brings us all renewal and resurrection hope!

The Generation Rx program is offered to educate people of all ages about the potential dangers of misusing prescription medications. In doing so, we strive to enhance medication safety in our communities. Prescription medications can help us live longer and healthier lives, but any medication has the potential to do harm – especially when misused (intentionally or unintentionally).

This program will provide tips and reminders to keep participants safe and healthy while using prescription medications. The Generation RX program focuses on medication safety among those 65 and older and their caregivers, but all are welcome to attend.
