The holidays are here! Advent and Christmas can be a time of joy, love, and warmth, but it can be a season of loss, especially for those whose loved ones have died in the last year. Or, perhaps, the traditions and familiar smells and tastes tend to dig up past grief and make it more potent.

There are many ways we celebrate the birth of Christ as a congregation at Christmas. Whether it is witnessing to the Nativity story for our community, sharing Christmas gifts to those in need, lifting spirits through music in choir or caroling, dancing around the Christmas tree, and sharing in our favorite foods, we each have special traditions that make the holidays special. However, we cannot forget to tend to our need for silence, stillness, and contemplation. We must not forget that December also holds the Longest Night, or the Winter Solstice. We must not skip to the joy of Christmas without first processing our feelings of sadness, anxiety, restlessness, fear, and weariness.

When we allow ourselves to actually feel those heavy emotions in our bodies, share how we really feel with a trusted friend, or move through the tension by going on a cold, brisk walk, then, we actually make space in our bodies, minds, and spirits for the joy. In the first Christmas, Mary and Joseph, too, were burdened by new laws that threatened their safety, they didn't have a stable place to call home. They were estranged from their community because of Mary's unplanned pregnancy. There was no room in the warm, comfortable inn. Let us not forget the discomfort, despair, and disgrace of that first Christmas because the truth is, it actually seems to relate a lot more to our real lives today.

When we acknowledge this shadow side of the good events in life, they seem to have a little bit less tight grip on us. We are truly able to make room in our hearts for joy, like Mary and Joseph made room for Jesus in the stable. No circumstances, conditions, or comfort could compare to the pure joy of the Christ child and the powerful shift of hope he brought to the world. I hope you will open yourself up to true joy this Christmas. It does not come from things or traditions, but from Emmanuel, God with us. We can face any difficulty in life knowing and trusting we are not alone.


**3 pm-Family Christmas Service**-come join us in the sanctuary for an interactive telling of the Christmas story and a small gift for you to take home too! All ages are encouraged to attend this service, and there will be candlelight (regular and battery powered candles) too!

**7 pm-Traditional Christmas Service**-come join us in the sanctuary for a service filled with meaning and hope. The Bethlehem Choir will sing, there will be a traditional sermon, and communion will be served. Candlelight happens at this service as well.

**9 pm-Christmas Under the Stars-**come join us in the parking lot for drive-in worship, where we will sing Christmas songs (and hear the service over our car radios), hear the Christmas gospel, and then, if you choose, get out of your car and sing Silent Night under the stars! Christmas Jammies are welcomed at this late night service!

On **Sundays during Advent, we will worship at 9 am** and be exploring the theme of **Immanuel: God with Us.** Each week will be centered around a gospel text, and we will walk through the themes of the Advent wreath candles. Our weekly themes will be:

- Nov 26, Week 1: We have hope because God is with us. Scripture: Matthew 1:1–17
- Dec 3, Week 2: We have peace because God is with us. Scripture: Matthew 1:18–25
- Dec 10, Week 3: We have joy because God is with us. Scripture: Luke 1:39–48
- Dec 17, Week 4: We have love because God is with us. Scripture: Luke 1:57–80



On Wednesdays nights we will gather first for soup supper from 5:45-6:45 pm for those who would like it.

The proceeds from soup suppers this year will go towards the Youth Gathering next summer. Then we will gather for Wednesday Midweek Worship at 7 pm, where we will sing Holden Evening Prayer and be exploring the theme of "How Does a Weary World Rejoice?".

Our weekly Wednesday themes will be:

- Nov 29, Week 1: We acknowledge our weariness. Scripture: Luke 1:1-23 and Psalm 80:1-7, 17-19
- Dec 6, Week 2: We find joy in connection. Scripture: Luke 1:24-45 and Isaiah 40:1-11
- Dec 13, Week 3: We allow ourselves to be amazed. Scripture: Luke 1:57-66 and Psalm 126
- Dec 20, Week 4: We sing stories of hope. Scripture: Luke 1:46-55 and Luke 1:67-80

Our prayer would be that when your family joins us for any or all of these Advent worship opportunities, that they will give you a place to reconnect with the reason for the season, a space to slow down and be filled with the love of God for you, and a chance to be refilled with the hope that can only come from that tiny child in the hay.

May your Advent season be filled with hope, peace, joy and love, friends, and may your weary souls find rest in God's greatest gift to you!


