Happy New Year!

January is a time to reset for year and reclaim our true, primary baptismal identity in Christ. This is our true source of belonging and connection. Gospel writer, Mark, tells the story of Jesus' own baptism like this:

⁹ In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰ And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove upon him. ¹¹ And a voice came from the heavens, "You are my Son, the Beloved; [d] with you I am well pleased" (Mark 1:9-11)

I encourage you to find a way to remember your own baptism this January. It might be when you wake up each morning and let the water from your shower run down your face just a few extra minutes. It might be when you drink a glass of refreshing water as you go about your day. Perhaps you will travel to a place with an ocean or sea in the winter months and you can reflect on the power behind each wave and see it as a reminder of God's redeeming and unfailing love. Maybe you will go ice fishing or see lakes and ponds frozen with ice. You can sense that the movement and dynamic water invisible underneath as a reminder that God is still with you when it is hard to sense or see. There are so many ways to remember your baptism through this gift of water.

Without water, we would not survive. This water of grace also signifies our hope, for without hope we would also perish. January in lowa can be one of the most intense and demanding months of our year. It's dark outside. The wind is bitterly cold. During this season of discipline and hibernation, be encouraged and know that God is with you, especially when we need it the most. God is our source of life, the only One who can revive and replenish our energy and hope. Let's begin our year with our baptism. Let's begin with our belovedness, which can never be taken away from you, regardless of what you encounter this coming year. Let us allow this precious gift of water and life bring us closer together to weather life's toughest seasons.
