Bethlehem Family and Friends,

I pray that your Lenten season has started well, and that each day as we draw closer to Easter, you find yourself drawing closer to Jesus.

It has been a busy few weeks here as we have begun our Midweek Lenten worship, began our Lenten book read (UnClobber by Colby Martin), began our Living Lent class (enjoying charcoal art the first week, sharing childhood memories the second, and living into what real rest means the third), and began both our Sunday and Wednesday Lenten worship series.

As these things are beginning, some things are ending as well. Both Pastor Kristi and Gabby are transitioning to exciting new job opportunities, which means that we are once again in a season of staff transition. We ask for your prayers for both Pastor Kristi and Gabby as they transition, and for the staff and parishioners that remain here at Bethlehem. We appreciate your patience while we are short staffed and while we figure out who is covering which responsibilities.

The council has also been working on hard on, praying for, and discerning a way forward in organizational structure for how we work together as a congregation. They are bringing to the Annual Meeting on April 21, an exciting plan for how we might view the work we do together, and I pray it will be a way that will provide even more transparency and clarity of how we do what we do, and who to talk to if you want to be more involved.

I recognize that sometimes seasons of transition put us on edge. They have a way of making us question, look back to times when things felt more steady, and can cause us worry. As your pastor, I have been trying hard to take time away to listen to where the Lord is leading us during these change-filled days.

While on a Silent Retreat with the Contemplative Outreach of Northeast Iowa this past Saturday, I learned a song, written by Lyndsey Scott, entitled "The Way Knows the Way". The words are: "You don't have to know the way, the way knows the way. You don't have to plan the way. Trust the way, feel your way. The way knows, The way knows The way knows the way." It has a hauntingly beautiful melody, and was for me the reminder that I needed that morning, that we may not know all of the steps that are coming down the road, but we know who journeys with us, and we know that God knows the way. He will lead us if we just listen, and follow. So let us do just that friends. May God bless each one of you as we listen and follow Him together.

Have you ever wanted to refresh your memory about the traditions and meanings behind why we celebrate communion as we do? Have you wondered about the connections between Seder Meals, Passover, and Communion? Would you like to have a hands on reminder of why we celebrate the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday?

All people of all ages are welcome to join us for a hands-on "This is My Body": Communion Refresher event on Sunday, March 24 and 2:00 pm \*

There is no cost; we just ask that you sign up on the welcome table with the number attending so that we have enough materials for everyone! Looking forward to learning with you!

\*=Note if you have children who have not yet received First Communion Instruction, this event will contain all the pieces needed for your child to participate in their First Communion at Maundy Thursday worship. On Sundays during Lent, our theme is: "Wandering Heart: Figuring Out Faith with Peter." In Peter, we see a person who is both steadfast and unsteady, a dear friend and a betrayer, a follower and a wanderer. In Peter, we often see ourselves. We will look for ourselves in the stepping stones of Peter's story. We will reflect on the stages of our own faith journey as well as who and

what has shaped us along the way. For each step of Peter's journey, we will focus on a phrase from the hymn "Come Thou Fount", as it reflects Peter's life. As we wander, let us tune our hearts to sing God's grace. May we rest in streams of mercy, never ceasing.

Mar 3-Praise the Mount (Peter proclaims who Jesus is)

Mar 10-I'm Fixed Upon It (Call to Discipleship)

Mar 17-Teach Me (Jesus Teaches about Forgiveness)

Mar 24-Songs of Loudest Praise (Palm Sunday)


### On Wednesdays this Lent, we will be living into the theme "This is My Body."


