



PASTOR'S PEN Dword from the heart

November is a good time to practice the spiritual discipline of gratitude. Did you know that thinking of a few things you are grateful for at the end of the day can boost your experience of joy and happiness? Our brains are hard-wired to scan for what could go wrong to keep us safe, but we can't live like this every day. When we train our brains to find the evidence for the good things in life, in addition to the scary things, people report greater satisfaction, contentment, and appreciation for life itself.

So, I want to share with you some questions you can ponder this month. You can journal or just check in with yourself. Maybe place your hand on your chest as you reflect:

Assess:

How am I really doing right now? Why?
What was enough for me today?
How did I show up today in a way that made me feel good?
What am I most grateful for today?

Allow:

What gets in the way of allowing myself to experience gratitude? What would it look like to approach my days with awe and wonder? What surprised me today? What does it feel like in my body to feel gratitude?

Act:

Where can I go from here? How can I make tomorrow even better? What is still missing? What's the next best step forward?

This month, as you celebrate Thanksgiving with your family and friends or show your appreciation for a friend or coworker, remember these three steps. You can put them in your pocket metaphorically or even write it on a note, so that you remember to practice gratitude as you go through your day.

This year, Advent is set to begin on December 3rd, with the final Sunday in Advent being the morning of Christmas Eve.

After some conversation and prayer, we have decided at Bethlehem to move Advent up a week so that we can fully appreciate the season. With that in mind, for us at Bethlehem, the first Sunday in Advent will be Sunday, November 26 and

Midweek Advent Worship will begin on Wednesday November 29th.

On **Sundays during Advent, we will worship at 9 am** and be exploring the theme of **Immanuel: God with Us.** Each week will be centered around a gospel text, and we will walk through the themes of the Advent wreath candles. Our weekly themes will be:

- Week 1: We have hope because God is with us. Scripture: Matthew 1:1–17
- Week 2: We have peace because God is with us. Scripture: Matthew 1:18–25
- Week 3: We have joy because God is with us. Scripture: Luke 1:39–48
- Week 4: We have love because God is with us. Scripture: Luke 1:57–80

On **Wednesdays nights**, we will gather first for **soup supper from 5:45-6:45 pm** for those who would like it. The proceeds from soup suppers this year will go towards the Youth Gathering next summer. Then we will gather for **Wednesday Midweek Worship at 7 pm**, where we will sing **Holden Evening Prayer** and be exploring the theme of **"How Does a Weary World Rejoice?"**. Our weekly Wednesday themes will be:

- Week 1: We acknowledge our weariness. Scripture: Luke 1:1-23 and Psalm 80:1-7, 17-19
- Week 2: We find joy in connection. Scripture: Luke 1:24-45 and Isaiah 40:1-11
- Week 3: We allow ourselves to be amazed. Scripture: Luke 1:57-66 and Psalm 126
- Week 4: We sing stories of hope. Scripture: Luke 1:46-55 and Luke 1:67-80

Our prayer would be that when your family joins us for any or all of these Advent worship opportunities, that they will give you a place to reconnect with the reason for the season, a space to slow down and be filled with the love of God for you, and a chance to be refilled with the hope that can only come from that tiny child in the hay.

May your Advent season be filled with hope, peace, joy and love, friends, and may your weary souls find rest in God's greatest gift to you!






